What is the Program?

The Insurance Premium Program assist eligible consumers with their health insurance premiums (co-payments) through the Department of Health, HIV/AIDS Administration of DC AIDS Drug Assistance Program (DC ADAP).

Who is Eligible?

*District of Columbia Residents.

*HIV Positive Individuals

*Consumers enrolled in a private health insurance plan that includes coverage for prescription drugs.

*Consumers who have an annual (yearly) income of \$52,000.00 or less

Consumers with less than \$25,000 in assets (not including primary residence and automobile)

How Do I Benefit?

Consumers who are eligible will receive financial assistance. The Consumers Insurance co-payments will be paid directly to the insurance carrier.

How Do I Apply?

All applicants must enroll through the AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP) by contacting the ADAP program.

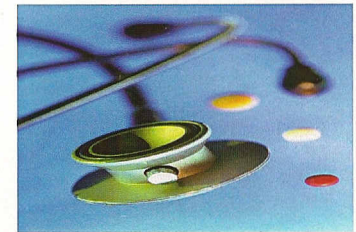

How Long Does it Take to Receive Approval?

The approval process takes 1-3 business days with complete paperwork. The application is then forwarded to DC CARE where premium payments are processed and paid directly to the insurance carrier.

Insurance Premium Assistance Program Rules

Consumers must be enrolled in an insurance plan that includes HIV care and a comprehensive drug benefit.



DC ADAP will only pay for the applicant's premium, not the premium for any immediate family members.

Monthly premium must be less than \$800.

No payments will be made to the Consumer directly; all payments will be made to the insurance company or employer.
